





The opportunities established through collaboration, partnership and a broad array of services promote life enhancing recovery and wellness for individuals, families and communities.

Adopted by the ROSC Transformation Steering Committee, September 30, 2010



ROSC Strategic Plan Goal III

To Increase Stakeholders' Understanding of Ways in which Services and Supports that Promote Recovery and Wellness may be Similar to, or Different from, Current Services.



Objective A: To enable stakeholders to distinguish current practices which are consistent with a recovery orientation from those that are not consistent.



ROSC Strategic Plan Goal IV

Objective A: To increase the number of people in recovery who are visible in leadership positions, within the system and throughout Michigan's communities.


